PAUL KLEE (born 1879)

Paul Klee was a great artist, and he was also a sympathetic teacher, fine musician, and persuasive writer. His work was diverse. Even paintings and drawings that he was working on at the same time could be very different in style and technique one from the next.

He is one of the most significant artists of the first part of the twentieth century.

FUN FACT!

Klee was ambidextrous. He wrote with his right hand and painted with his left.

Klee developed his own **colour** theory based on a six-part rainbow shaped into a **colour** wheel. He made a Colour wheel to help artists to find colours that complement each other.

MAKING YOUR KLEE INSPIRED BOOKMARK

Measure your watercolour paper to create a strip long enough to fit your name....approx. 30cm or the length of a ruler.

If your name is short (4 letters) you can have extra squares of colours!

DIVIDE THE STRIP INTO SQUARES approx 5-7

WRITE YOUR NAME IN CAPITALS making sure you STRETCH THEM ACROSS EACH SQUARE.

USE YOUR WATERCOLOURS TO FILL IN THE SPACES INBETWEEN THE LINES OF EACH LETTER.

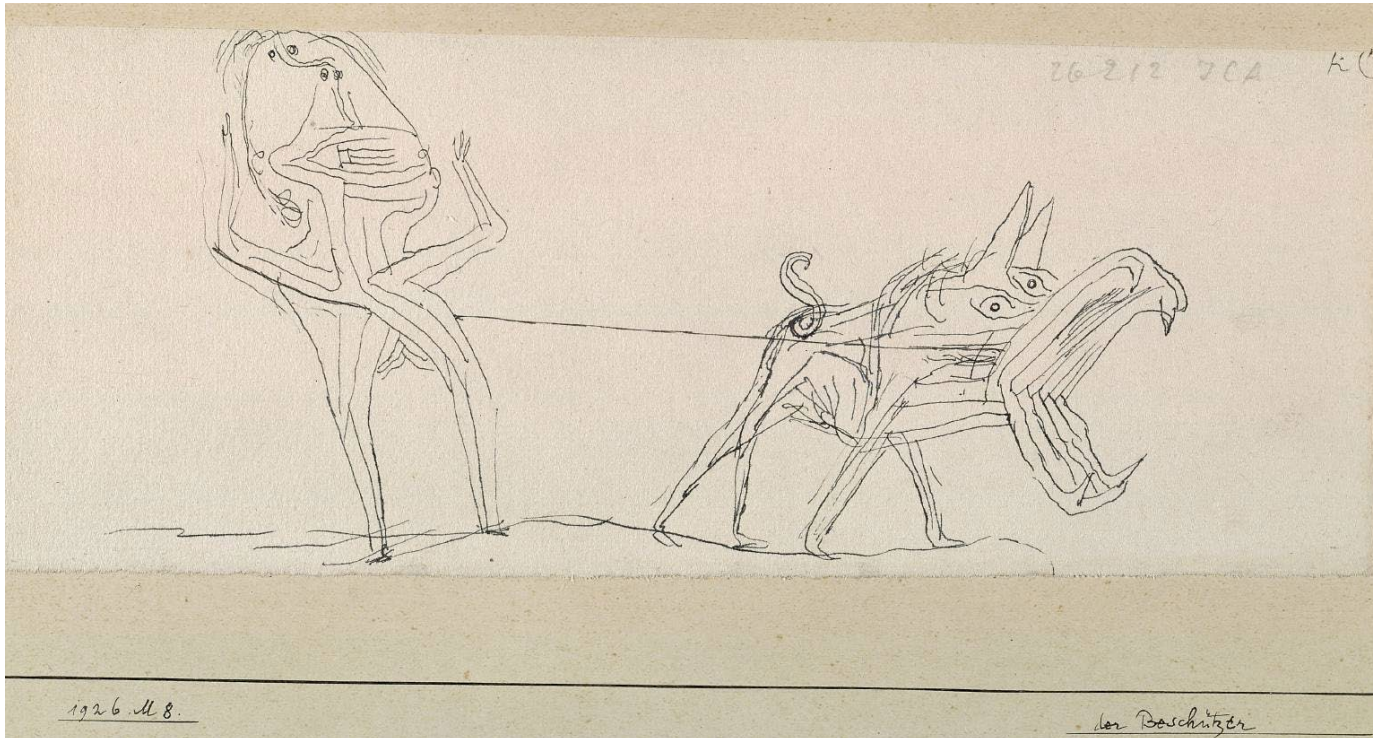
